## WHY?



Here are a few statistics which will shock but, at the same time, probably won't surprise you. According to new research by the Youth Sport Trust, children in the UK are:

- **Unhappier** - 20.3% of children aged 8 to 16 in England have a probable mental health disorder
- **Unhealthier** - 23.4% of Year Six and 10.1% of reception children in England are obese and rates are higher than before the pandemic
- **More distracted** - 78% of parents believe that children are spending too much time online and not enough time with each other in person

“This powerful new research clearly shows the importance of young people taking part in sport and physical activity at school. We know that healthy and happy children learn better.

In particular, more needs to be done to ensure that girls remain active throughout their school careers. We have seen both enjoyment and participation levels in PE drop in recent years and as this latest research shows, taking part in sport can play an important role in life satisfaction and happiness for girls.”

## Our 2024 Achievements:

- A record 4,950 children attended across our programmes
- Worked with 53 mainstream primary and special schools
- Supported by volunteers - 57 providing over 715 hours of volunteer coaching worth over £7,000 coaching time to the Trust

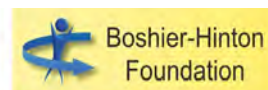

# Cricket & Countryside Education Days

The programme is aimed at giving children from mainstream primary and special schools the opportunity to visit the Belvoir Estate and take part in cricket coaching sessions and countryside education.

The children learn from professional cricket coaches and meet the farmer, gamekeeper, the hounds, fly birds of prey and take part in fishing, archery, orienteering and Army team building exercises. The Trust puts on 27 days for the children to learn and visit the Belvoir Estate.



## 2024 Outcomes

- 30 primary and SEN schools from Leicestershire, Nottinghamshire and Lincolnshire visited the Estate
- 1,510 children and over 107 school staff attended 20 days
- 33 volunteers assisted on the days

# Special Needs Schools Programme



Working with special needs schools delivering specialist coaching in table and kwik cricket for young people with learning and physical disabilities to develop their skills and confidence.

Delivered in partnership with Nottinghamshire County Cricket Club, Lincolnshire Cricket Board, Leicestershire County Cricket Club and the Lord's Taverners, the project also gives schools the opportunity to attend a Cricket & Countryside Education Day on the Belvoir Estate for their pupils to take part in cricket and countryside activities delivered by our volunteers.

## 2024 Outcomes

- 804 children took part in the project
- 502 children in 11 schools received 5 weeks of Table Cricket and Kwik cricket coaching
- 219 children took part in 5 Table Cricket Tournaments
- 70 children from 6 schools visited the Belvoir Estate on a Cricket and Countryside Day
- 135 hours of curriculum coaching delivered and CPD opportunities provided to school staff
- 13 children from Melton Mencap took part in a holiday activity day
- The programme was supported by the Lord's Taverners to deliver the Table Cricket

# Teach Basketball & Cricket Programme

Delivering a three-week curriculum programme in cricket and basketball to in Leicestershire, Nottinghamshire and Lincolnshire primary schools.

The programme provides Continuing Professional Development training for the school staff.



## 2024 Teach Basketball

- 804 children took part in the programme
- Delivered the programme to 31 classes in 15 primary schools
- Delivered one after-school club and helped run the local Primary school's finals tournament
- 99 hours of coaching delivered

## 2024 Teach Cricket

- 757 children took part in the programme
- Delivered the programme to 33 classes in 17 primary schools
- 99 hours of coaching delivered

# Belvoir Bees Cricket & Basketball

The Bees project aims to provide cricket and basketball community coaching opportunities throughout the year.

They provide out of school routes for our school curriculum sessions and links for further participation at local clubs.



## 2024 Basketball outcomes

- 2 venues ran at Melton Mowbray and Grantham
- 71 children took part
- 72 hours of community coaching provided

## 2024 Cricket outcomes

- 5 venues at Melton, Hose, Asfordby, Great Dalby and Knipton
- 151 children took part
- 72 hours of community coaching provided
- The sessions were supported by 33 local volunteers, giving 242 hours helping with sports coaching and administration of the sessions

# Primary School Curriculum and after-school Clubs Programme

Working in schools delivering National Curriculum Physical Education lessons and after-school multi-sports clubs. Working with the schools' teaching staff to provide quality Continuing Professional Development for PE.



## 2024 outcomes

- Delivered curriculum teaching to 78 children in 2 village primary schools: Croxton Kerrial and Wymondham throughout the year
- Delivered 3 after-school clubs reaching 58 children

- Delivered a one-off 'work it weekly' session at 4 primary schools reaching 73 children
- Delivered one-off sessions to 23 classes at 6 primary schools reaching 618 children

- 20 hours of volunteer time were given towards the scheme

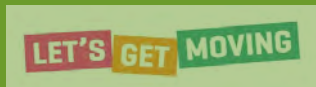

If you pay at the higher rate you can claim further tax relief in your Self-assessment tax return.  
If you are unsure whether your donations qualify for Gift Aid tax relief, ask the charity. Or, refer to donations by individuals. Please notify the charity if you change your name or address.
